2009 Late Lottery & Gaming Credit Claims

Question: What if my 2009 tax bill did not have the Lottery and Gaming Credit listed?

It is not too late! If you did not receive the lottery credit on your 2009 Real Estate Property Tax Bill, you may file a late claim with the State of Wisconsin Department of Revenue until October 1, 2010. If you owned your home and used it as your primary residence on January 1, 2009, you will need to complete and mail a "2009 Late Lottery and Gaming Credit Application" (Form LC-300).

If you purchased your home after January 1, 2009 and the property was used by the previous owner as a primary residence on January 1, 2009 you will need to complete and mail a "2009 Late Lottery & Gaming Credit Application" (Form LC-310).

Both forms are available at Village Hall or can be downloaded at www.dor.state.wi.us. Click on the "forms" icon on the left-hand side of the web-site and enter in the form number you would like to print.

2nd Installment Payment of Real Estate Taxes

If you are paying your 2009 Real Estate taxes in installments, your second payment is due July 31, 2010. **This payment must be sent to the Dane County Treasurer.** If payment is sent to Village Hall, we will return your payment to you and will not forward the payment to the Dane County Treasurer. The Village can only accept 2009 tax payments through January 31, 2010. You may also pay your taxes on-line at www.co.dane.wi.us. Click on "Departments" then "Treasurer". The treasurer's office mailed out payment notices in June. If you have questions on your second installment payment, call the Dane County Treasurer's office at 266-4151.

RESIDENTIAL RECYCLING GUIDE

REMEMBER: When in doubt, throw it in your regular garbage container.

Glass Containers

- Color: Clear, Green or Brown
- No need to remove labels
- All bottles and jars must be rinsed out.
- NO** window glass, light bulbs, TV tubes, drinking glass, etc

Plastic

- All** Containers Marked on the Bottom with #1 (PETE) thru Type #5 and Type #7.
- All plastic bottles must be rinsed out.
- No deli or butter containers.

Tin or Bi-Metal Containers

- Soup, Vegetable, Juice **ONLY**
- Rinse Clean
- Labels do not need to be removed

Aluminum

- Cans Only
- Drain Liquids and Rinse Clean
- NO** Foil, Pie Plates or Pop Tabs

Newspapers/Magazines

- Glossy inserts, catalogs, mail circulars, phone books, paperback books, cereal boxes, envelopes and wrapping paper

Cardboard/Paper Bags

- Brown Paper Bags
- Clean Cardboard with Ribbed Layer Between Two Flat Pieces (Corrugated)
- Flatten All Boxes

Waste Oil

- Common engine oil only. Must be in a leak-proof, non breakable containers.
- Limit 2 one-gallon containers with lid, per week.**

Lead Acid Vehicle Batteries


- Car and Truck batteries only. Battery casings must be unbroken. Set these next to the recycling cart.

Tires

- Car tires off the rim will be picked up.
- Limit 2 tires per week with the maximum of 8 tires per calendar year.**

Disposal of Lawn Mowers & Grills

- Lawn Mowers (push type only):** Remove the spark plug and all the gas inside the tank.
- Gas Grills:** Remove the propane tank and cord.
- Charcoal Grills:** Remove all coals





2010 REFUSE AND RECYCLING PICK UP DATES

Your refuse and recycling pick up date is Monday if you are South of Cottage Grove Road or live in Coyle Highlands. Your refuse and recycling pick up date is Tuesday if you are North of Cottage Grove Road. Please have your refuse and recycling out by 6am at your curb. **NOTE: No Refuse/Recycling Collection on September 6, 2010. Collection will be September 7& 8, 2010.**

Village's Ordinance on Fences and Hedges

§325-88A. Residential Fences. Fences or hedges for residential one (1) and two (2) family dwellings shall be erected or planted within the lot lines. All fences and hedges shall be erected or planted so as to not depreciate any immediate property or endanger any lives as determined by the Building Inspector. Residential fences shall comply with the following requirements:

1. Dimensional Requirements.

- (a) The maximum dimension of wood posts shall be six (6) inches nominal.
- (b) The maximum dimension of boards shall be one (1) by eight (8) inches nominal.
- (c) The maximum diameter of individual pickets of a stockade fence shall be three (3) inches nominal.
- (d) The use of doors or plywood sheets is prohibited.
- (e) All structural elements of the fence shall face the interior of the lot on which the fence is erected unless otherwise exempted by the Building Inspector.
- (f) Barbed wire and electrical fences are prohibited.
- (g) Fences and hedges in side and rear yards shall not exceed six (6) feet in height from ground level.
- (h) Fences or hedges on side yards shall not extend beyond the front building line of the dwelling.
- (i) Where such lot line is adjacent to non-residentially zoned property, there shall be an eight (8) foot height limit from ground level.

B. Fences and Hedges in Street Yards. Only decorative fences or hedges may be erected in street yards subject to the following requirements:

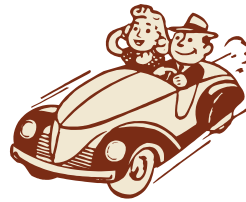
- (1) Decorative fences or hedges shall be defined as a barrier, which utilizes natural materials such as wood or stone, ornamental vinyl or steel, and includes such plant materials as hedges. Wire, chain link, or cyclone types of fencing materials are prohibited.
- (2) No fencing will be allowed in a right-of-way or easement.
- (3) No fence or hedge shall be erected, constructed, maintained, or grown to a height exceeding three (3) feet above the street grade nearest thereto.
- (4) No fence or hedge shall be erected on any corner lot less than ten (10) feet from the traveled portion of any public highway. Fences or hedges are also prohibited in any location where such barrier creates a potentially hazardous site-line situation, as determined by the Building Inspector. In making such determination the Building Inspector shall utilize the "Vision Triangle Formula" of the Village Engineer.

C. Setback for Fences and Hedges. A fence may be erected up to the lot line, but no part of the fence or post may encroach over the lot line.

When do I need a building permit?

The Village of Cottage Grove requires a building permit for:

1. New construction of any residential structure
 2. Any alterations to an existing structure
 - ☼ Additions
 - ☼ Fences
 - ☼ Decks
 - ☼ Garages
 - ☼ Re-siding and/or reroofing
 - ☼ Changing/adding electrical, heating/cooling or plumbing
 - ☼ Changing/adding water softener, water heater or hot tub
 - ☼ Sheds
 - ☼ Demolition
 3. Any construction on commercial property

Keep Your Driving Costs Down This Summer

With summer here many of us are thinking about taking a road-trip or a vacation, but fuel prices are so high that it may seem impossible to keep your traveling expenses affordable. Don't despair! There are some tried and true tips for you to take that trip and still have some spending money when you get there!

- ☼ Check your tires. Under-inflated tires are a safety hazard and can have a negative affect on your fuel economy. Be sure to check your tire pressure before you start a long trip.
- ☼ Lighten your load. Studies show that driving around with a fully loaded trunk or hatch can result in lower gas mileage. And although you have to pack for your trip you should clean out unnecessary items before you load your trunk.
- ☼ Go cruisin'. If your vehicle is equipped with Cruise Control use it! One web-site (www.edmunds.com) states that using cruise control at highway speeds can save you an average of 7% overall!
- ☼ Windows vs. air conditioning? The myth that using air conditioning will ruin your fuel economy has been busted! Several studies show that using air conditioning has only a negligible effect on your gas mileage. The same is true for driving with your windows down. Yes it creates drag, but the effects are so small it just doesn't have an impact. So use what is comfortable and don't worry about the temperature.
- ☼ Keep it steady. Rapid starts and stops will ding your wallet and it isn't safe. Try to avoid revving the engine or accelerating too fast from a stop. It wastes fuel and is unnecessary. In city driving it's almost impossible to avoid frequent stops so try to avoid "Business Loops" while on your trip.
- ☼ Obey the speed limit. Drivers who consistently drive over the speed limit are losing between 15 and 98 cents per gallon! That can really add up so take your time and follow the speed limit.

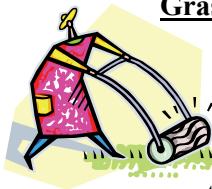


Dane County Rodefeld Compost Site

Grass Clippings & Leaves



The Village has an ordinance prohibiting the depositing of organic materials such as grass clippings and/or leaves into the streets. The purpose of this ordinance is to help keep the storm sewer inlets clean.

By keeping the inlets clean it improves the quality of the water running through the sewers that eventually ends up in the lakes and streams. If you have any leaves, grass or garden waste please take them to our composting site

Village Hall is again selling All-Hazard Radios (aka weather radios) to the public. Dane County has made a bulk purchase of these radios and the Village of Cottage Grove and surrounding municipalities will have them for purchase. The cost is \$25 and includes 4-AA batteries.

- ◆ Should not be more than 6 feet in length.
- ◆ No root balls, bags, boxes or containers full of brush.
- ◆ Cut ends should be pointed toward the curb.
- ◆ No whole cut down trees, only trimmings
- ◆ Please have your brush out at your curb by 6:00 a.m. the Monday morning of pick-up week. **With the growth of the Village, your brush may not be collected on that exact day but you will need to have it ready.**

Cottage Grove Fire Department

The Cottage Grove Volunteer Fire Department would like to wish everyone a safe and happy cookout season! Here are some simple safety tips to follow to prevent fires and injuries while grilling out:



-Propane and charcoal grills must only be used outdoors. If used indoors, or in any enclosed spaces such as tents, they pose both a fire hazard and the risk of exposing occupants to toxic gases and potential asphyxiation.

-Position the grill well away from siding, deck railings and out from under eaves and overhanging branches.

-Place the grill a safe distance from lawn games, play areas and foot traffic.

-Keep children and pets away from the grill area: declare a three-foot "safe zone" around the grill.

-Put out several long-handled grilling tools to give the chef plenty of clearance from heat and flames when flipping burgers.

-Periodically remove grease or fat buildup in trays below grill so it cannot be ignited by a hot grill.

Charcoal Grills:

-Purchase the proper starter fluid and store the can out of reach of children, and away from heat sources.

-Never add charcoal starter fluid when coals or kindling have already been ignited, and never use any flammable or combustible liquid other than charcoal starter fluid to get the fire going.

Propane Grills:

-Check the gas cylinder hose for leaks before using it for the first time each year. A light soap and water solution applied to the hose will quickly reveal escaping propane by releasing bubbles. If you determine your grill has a gas leak, by smell or the soapy bubble test, and there is no flame, turn off the gas tank and grill. If the leak stops, get the grill serviced by a professional before using it again. If the leak does not stop, call the fire department or 911.

-If you smell gas while cooking, immediately get away from the grill and call the fire department or 911. Do not attempt to move the grill.

-Never store propane gas cylinders in buildings or garages. If you store a gas grill inside during the winter, disconnect the cylinder and leave it outside.

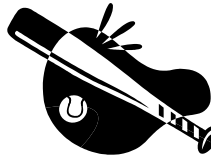

Mallards Baseball – Cottage Grove Night 2 for 1 Tickets - July 7th

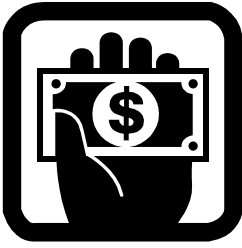

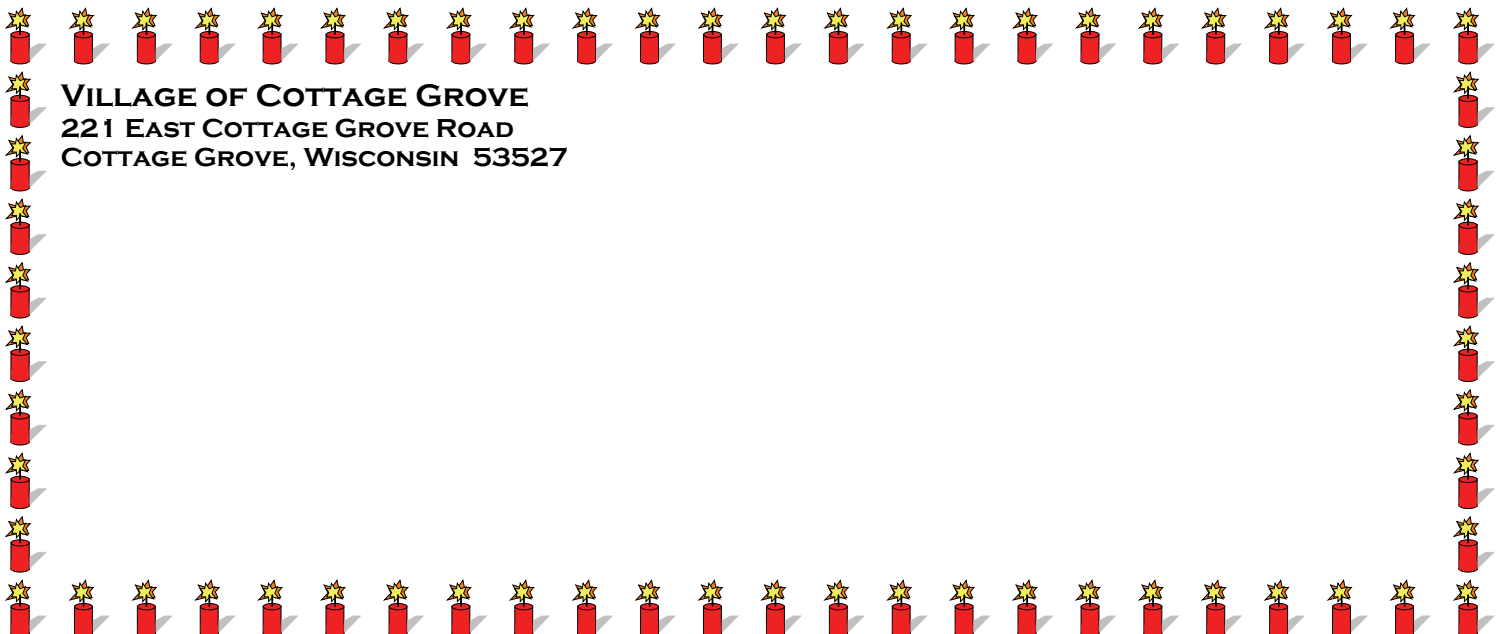
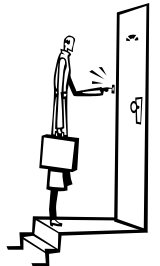
